ORDINANCE DESIGNATING THE PROPERTY OF John W. Hinsdale and wife, Ellen Hinsdale
of Wake County
OCATED AT 330 Hillsborough Street
N THE CITY OF RALEIGH, NORTH CAROLINA, A HISTORIC SITE.
WHERFAS, the General Assembly of the State of North Carolina authorized the reation of a Historic Sites Commission for the City of Raleigh and otherwise rovided for the preservation of certain historic sites and buildings by the passage f Chapter 1058 of the 1967 Session Laws of North Carolina; and
WHEREAS, the Raleigh Historic Sites Commission has made an investigation and ecommended the following property be designated a Historic Site; and
WHEREAS, the North Carolina State Department of Archives and History has made n analysis and recommendation that the following property be designated a historic ite; and
WHEREAS, on the <u>16</u> day of <u>April</u> , 19 68, a joint public hearing was held in the Council Chambers of the Municipal Building, Raleigh, North Carolina, by the Historic Sites Commission and the City Council of the City of Raleigh to letermine whether the hereinafter described property should be designated a historic
WHEREAS, said hearing was advertised and the property owners of the property described were notified by certified mail of the date and purpose of said public hearing at least ten (10) days prior to the date set for the hearing; and
WHEREAS, all requirements of Chapter 1058 of the 1967 Session Laws of North Carolina, preceeding the adoption of this ordinance, have been complied with.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RALEICH THAT:
Section 1. The Property of John W. Hinsdale and wife, Ellen Hinsdale
of Wake County
Located at 330 Hillsborough Street in the City of Raleigh, North Carolina, be and is hereby declared a historic site. Said property being more particularly described as follows:
HINSDALE HOUSE  BEGINNING on Hillsboro Street at the southwest corner of a lot belonging to James A. Briggs runs westward with said street one hundred and five feet to its intersection with Harrington Street. Thence with Harrington Street, northward two hundred and ten feet to Edenton Street thence eastward with Edenton Street one hundred and five feet to James A. Brigg's northwest corner thence southward with said Brigg's line two hundred and ten feet to the beginning and bring the same lot of land that was conveyed to the said W. H. Dodd by Deed from James Dodd as recorded in Book 33, Page 155.

Section 2. No building or structure located on the herinbefore described site may be demolished or materially altered unless and until a sixty-day (60) written notice to the Historic Sites Commission of the intent to demolish or materially alter said structure, and the clapsing of said sixty-day (60) period.

Section 3. That all owners and occupants of the property hereinabove described, whose identity and addresses can be ascertained by the exercise of due diligence be sent by certified mail a copy of this ordinance.

Section 4. This ordinance shall be indexed under the property owner's name in the grantor index in the Office of the Register of Deeds of Wake County as provided by Chapter 1058 of the 1967 Session Laws of North Carolina.

Section 5. City administration and the Historic Sites Commission are hereby authorized and directed to have erected an appropriate sign on the site hereinabove described setting forth the fact that said site has been designated a historic site by action of the Historic Sites Commission and the City Council of the City of Raleigh provided, should the owners of the hereinabove described property not consent to the erection of said sign on the described premises, City administration and the Historic Sites Commission are hereby authorized and directed to have said sign located on the public right of way adjacent to said property.

Section 6. Any violation of this ordinance shall be unlawful as by law provided.
